

Next Editor in Chief Selected

His editorship will begin in 2023, following the tenure of Marion E. Broome, PhD, RN, FAAN, who has led the journal for 20 highly successful years.



Dr. Clarke is executive vice dean and professor at the New York University Rory Meyers College of Nursing in New York. He is a health outcomes and policy researcher specializing in nursing issues and has particular interests in the nursing workforce, nurse occupational health, organizational contexts of quality and safety of practice, program and policy evaluation, and comparative health systems. He has published widely in these areas and has taught nursing and health policy in universities in Canada, the US, Europe, and Asia at the bachelor's through doctoral levels for over 25 years. In addition to research collaborations, speaking and consultation globally, he has been involved in journal editing and editorial boards for nursing and health sciences journals since the beginning of his career.

A fellow of the American Academy of Nursing, **Dr. Clarke has been a member of the editorial board of *Nursing Outlook* for the past 5 years and is very excited to work closely with stakeholders to continue the proud traditions of the journal as the leading venue for research and scholarship about the evolution of the nursing profession and its role in society.**

Now in its 70th year of publication, *Nursing Outlook* is the official journal of the American Academy of Nursing. President Kenneth R.
